
I arrived in NZ 15 years ago and peddled around both islands on my push-bike (don't ask me why... but it seemed a good idea at the time).

# A TASTE OF PARADISE



*Fiji turns out to be a food-lover's paradise*

Water temperature of 28 degrees, sunshine every day, pristine sandy beaches and fresh yellowfin tuna for only NZ\$4 a kilo. You really can't get much better than that. Yup, Fiji really must be paradise. In fact, it may be more of a food lover's paradise than previously thought. On return from a recent delivery to Fiji, every one of my partner's stories seemed to revolve in some way around food.

Not that the food on passage was anything to write home about. While the skipper had lovingly prepared and frozen single portions of basic, quickly re-heatable meals, sea-sickness among two thirds of the crew left most meal preparation up to just one person. And while I had oh-so-thoughtfully packed my partner's bags with all manner of morale-boosting lollies, choccies and sweet-and-sugaries for his first offshore passage (all the things I'd longed for on my cold, dark,

lonely nights on watch...) I was left with no uncertainty that my misguided kindness was entirely to blame for the 5 days of 'mal de mer' he suffered.

So perhaps that explains why Fijian food got such glowing reviews. The first real food after being at sea, having dined on little else but jelly beans and gummi bears for 8 days, must be quite something. Particularly if it's fresh crayfish - plucked that day from the glistening waters surrounding the Savusavu reef. Unfortunately the same cannot be said of taro. This innocuous-looking root vegetable apparently came highly recommended by all the locals, but once cooked, resembled something you might build houses with, and tasted not much better. Perhaps there's a local secret to cooking it. Or perhaps it is best eaten after a long and leisurely aperitif

of kava, after which you probably don't much care that you're eating a bowl of Epifill. One thing is certain - he can't wait to return to sample more of the culinary delights Fiji has to offer, because with only 5 days in port before his flight home, it was really only a mere morsel that he got to sample. It is certainly easy to see how you could fall in love with the place where delicious, fresh seafood is so abundant and cheap. I think it might even be worth the week or so's subsistence diet of Whittaker's and water. I'll find out next year, I guess.
